<b>Training Programme Title</b>	First Aider Skills Programme
<b>Objective of this service</b>	<p>Provide clear understanding and practical knowledge to the learner/employees to enable them to provide primary emergency care (first aid) in response to an occupational risk induced or any health emergency in their specific workplaces. Provide clear understanding and practical knowledge to the learner to assess the emergency situation and provide basic life support and basic first aid in order to stabilize patients prior to transfer to the emergency services.</p> <p>Provides a broad introduction to HIV/AIDS in the workplace. It introduces a broad case of knowledge about HIV/AIDS that will enable learners to be informed and caring workers in an industry. The focus is knowledge, skills, values and attitudes in relation to the learner's own context and experience of the world of work.</p>
